Sauvion du Cleray, Vallet, Loire, France
If only all Muscadet tasted this good! Bone dry, but packed with delicious citrus fruit flavours.
15. CHABLIS Bois d'Yver 2010 30.50
Domaine de Bois d'Yver, Chablis, Burgundy, France
The Bois d'Yver Chablis exhibits a steely fruitiness combined with a clean, crisp freshness and a generous weight.
16. SANCERRE, 2010 29.50
Serge Laporte, Loire, France
Classic Sancerre with all the chalkiness and gooseberry steely fruit that you expect from this great Loire Sauvignon Blanc.
18. POUILLY FUMÉ, Villa Paulus, 2008 32.00
Domaine Masson-Blondelet, Loire, France
With terrific balance and depth, and the elegance and the smoky richness that only Pouilly Fumé, of all the Sauvignon Blancs, can achieve.
19. GRENACHE-SAUVIGNON BLANC, 2010 125ml 2.60 175ml 3.65 250ml 5.05

Klippenkop, Western Cape, South Africa

24. MAYVAL, Medium Dry 2009 22.50
Manstree Estate, Exeter, Devon
From their beautiful estate just outside Exeter, the Boyce family grow fantastic Madeline Angevine and Seyval Blanc grapes which are blended together in this off dry, fruity fresh elegant wine.

25. CLOUDY BAY SAUVIGNON BLANC, 2010 40.00
Cloudy Bay, Marlborough, New Zealand
The ultimate New World Sauvignon from one of the most famous wineries in the world. Concentrated and aromatic with classic elderflower and gooseberry fruit, and a complex tropical fruit quality.
26. SAUVIGNON BLANC, 2010 125ml 3.90 175ml 5.50 250ml 7.60 22.50
Frog Haven, Marlborough, New Zealand
Pale straw in colour with a bouquet of classic Marlborough characters - intense nettle green aromas of gooseberry, redcurrant and citrus. The palate is well balanced and vibrant, with persistent flavours and crisp acidity.

27. CAMEL VALLEY 'BACCHUS' DRY, 2010 29.95
Camel Valley Vineyard, Cornwall
Young, aromatic, fresh and zesty, England's answer to Sancerre. A bright accompaniment to seafood, full of zip and fruit. Bacchus is a modern Sylvaner/Reisling cross that produces wine with a distinctive fruity bouquet and a grapey flavour
29. VIOGNIER, 2010 21.00
Domaine St Hilaire, Vin de Pays d'Oc, France
Domaine St. Hilaire's Viognier is alluringly exotic, with an aroma of ripe apricots, peaches and honeysuckle. The palate exudes lush and unctuous fruit flavours, which is due to the fact that the vines are over 20 years old and were planted long before this variety was fashionable.
30. PINOT BLANC, 2007/09 21.50
Domaine Henry Fuchs, Ribeauvillé, Alsace, France
From a virtually organic winery, which dramatically reduces its yields to produce outstandingly concentrated, rich and weighty wines. Off, to medium dry with a very long, honeyed finish.
31. RIESLING, 2008 32.50
Hermann Donnhoff, Nahe, Germany
Fuller bodied than the fine Rieslings of the Mosel, the best wines of the Nahe region are piercingly aromatic with fine lime fresh nose, a white peach fruitiness, a unique minerality and outstanding balance.
One of the best Estates in Germany, let alone the Nahe, the Donnhoffs have been making wine since the 1750's, and Helmut Donnhoff, the present winemaker has been awarded Gault Millau's winemaker of the year, credited with playing a crucial part in reestablishing the reputation of German Riesling.

Richer, Weighty, and Oaked Whites

We have marked the wines (O) which have a perceptible oak influence.

32. RIOJA BLANCO, Monople, 2008 (O) 25.50
C.V.N.E, Haro. Rioja Alta, Spain
This could only be White Rioja, with its intense, crisp citrusy fruit, which is barrel fermented, giving a pervasive oakiness, and a lovely long creamy finish. Superb!
33. CÔTEAUX DU TRICASTIN BLANC "Gourmandises" 2010 19.95
Domaine de Montine, Rhone, France
We are very pleased with the recent discovery of the quite delicious wines from Domaine de Montine, situated at Grignan in the heartlands of Tricastin country. The 'Gourmandises' has a greenish-gold colour coupled with a bouquet of aromatic floral fruit where there are clear overtones of limes, apricots and blossom. Wonderfully fresh and zesty, this is a very well balanced dry white with masses of length. 25% Marsanne, 25% Roussanne, 25% Clairette and 25% Viognier
34. CHABLIS 1ER CRU, Mont de Milieu, 2009 41.50
Domaine Pinson, Chablis, Burgundy, France
Established in the early 17th Century, this 10 hectare estate is one of the most 'senior' estates in Chablis, both in terms of its reputation and the sheer quality of its wines. The Mont de Milieu is a full-bodied 1er Cru, rich with honeyed fruit and tremendous concentration of flavour. A great Chablis from a great vintage.
35. MACON BLANC DAVAYÉ, 2009 26.50
Domaine des Maillettes, Maconnais, Burgundy 125ml 4.70 175ml 6.60 250ml 9.20
A luscious "mineral" Chardonnay, with masses of generous but very pure fruit, and a sensational rich finish.
36. PULIGNY MONTRACHET, les Charmes, 2008/09 51.00
Domaine Jean-Louis Chavy, Burgundy, France
From one of the finest estates in Puligny, comes this almost perfect expression of White Burgundy, from a superb vintage. Tremendous purity of fruit, and a concentrated, rich creamy finish.
37. CHARDONNAY/VIOGNIER, 2010 125ml 3.25 175ml 4.40 250ml 6.10
Elementos, San Juan, Argentina 18.00
The Chardonnay/Viognier is a delicious yet medium-bodied wine with zesty citrus fruit, hints of peaches and apricots leading to a soft fruit finish. An excellent partner for chicken, fish or pasta dishes, while it can equally well be enjoyed on its own.
38. ALENTEJO RESERVA, 2009 (O) 30.50
Herdade do Esporao, Portugal
Esporão Branco D.O.C. Reserva is a ripe and rich, full bodied dry white wine with fantastic depth and complexity resulting from fermentation in new American oak barrels. Crystal clear, straw colour. On the nose, peach and melon fruit with spicy oak touches. Rich, complex, creamy palate, ripe ... A great find.
40. PINOT GRIS, 2008 27.00
Firesteed Estate, Oregon, USA
Showing great varietal characteristics of ripe pear, this superbly concentrated wine also hints at Crème Brulée and cinnamon, with a fleshy richness underpinned by a brilliant mineral edge. Off dry, and delightful with full flavoured dishes.

Light Fruity Reds

Great without food, or with salads, light meat and many fish dishes.

41. BEAUJOLAIS VILLAGES, 2009 22.50
Chateau de Grandmont, Beaujolais, France
Jean-Charles Pivot is a master winemaker and this wonderfully fresh and fruity wine is undoubtedly of 'Cru' quality. This is crammed to the brim with soft, juicy and very succulent raspberry and red cherry flavours.
42. FLEURIE, 2009 28.00
Domaine des Grands Cedres, Beaujolais, France
Fleurie is known as the 'Queen' of Beaujolais because of its elegance and finesse. Produced from 100% old vine Gamay, this is fresh, light and 'ultra-juicy'
43. TARRANGO, 2008 17.50
Brown Brothers, Milawa, Victoria, Australia
Tarrango is a specially developed grape variety producing a very light yet full flavoured cherry scented red, which drinks perfectly on its own or with lighter meat and fish dishes.
44. SANCERRE ROUGE, Les Cailleries 2005 40.00
Domaine Vacheron, Loire, France
One of the view domaines that produce excellent red Sancerre as well as white. Great red-purple colour with a very appealing nose stuffed with Pinot Noir character - slightly roasted black cherry fruit, with a streak of fine, dark chocolate. Silky texture and a persistent satin finish. Lightish and very elegant.

Classic, E legant, Fruit-Driven Reds

Classic wines to accompany food, these are stylish and elegant, perfect with all meat dishes, and for those who prefer a less fleshy style of wine

45. MERCUREY, les Chazeaux, 2008 37.00
Domaine Jean Marechal, Mercurey, Burgundy, France
This small family owned winery specialises in deeply coloured, intense wines, and their 'single vineyard' Mercurey has sweet black cherry fruit on the nose, and complex layers of black fruit and a hint of oak, on the palate.
46. GEVREY CHAMBERTIN, 2008 51.00
Domaine Dupont-Tisserandot, Cote de Nuits, Burgundy, France
An exciting find, this Domaine only ships a tiny amount to the UK, mostly selling to some of the best Parisian restaurants. Their reds are simply superb - ripe, concentrated, handcrafted wines, with silky black cherry fruitiness and superbly integrated oak.
47. CHÂTEAU DES JOUALLES, 2009 22.00
Bordeaux Superieur, France
From the same team that made the excellent Château Lassegue, St Emilion. This is deeply coloured, ripe, fruit-driven Claret, with excellent structure.
60% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 20% Cabernet Franc.
48. RIOJA RESERVA, 2005 28.50
Ondarre, Rioja, Spain 125ml 4.95 175ml 7.00 250ml 9.80
From one of the most advanced and quality conscious wineries in Rioja, the Reserva is aged for over three years (two in oak casks), before being released. Full of rich, ripe oaky fruit, with a superb, long vanilla finish.
49. PINOT NOIR, 'Tom's Block' 2006 39.00
Neudorf Vineyards, Nelson, New Zealand
A serious contender to Burgundy here from the Nelson pioneers. Gamey and spicy with pure raspberry and black cherry fruit all put together with a vanilla wood veneer that gives a glacier smoothness.

Rich, Rounded Smooth Reds

Listed in order of weight (lighter first) these wines are mostly fuller bodied with fantastic concentration of fleshy ripe fruit.

50. PINOT NOIR, 2010 125ml 3.45 175ml 4.65 250ml 6.45
Chateau de Coussergues, Vin de Pays d'Oc, France 19.00
This is not a jammy Pinot as it has an appealing freshness and vivacity that raises it to a serious class. It is quite remarkable value. Vibrant pale ruby colour, the palate is bursting with strawberry and blackberry fruit with a hint of woodiness enveloped in a rich earthy backdrop. Good acidity and length.
51. VALPOLICELLA, Classico Superiore, 2009 22.50
Tedeschi, Veneto, Italy
Medium bodied, soft and voluptuous, with complex aromas of leather and spice, and a pervasive cherry fruitiness. Outstanding.
53. PINOTAGE, 2010 18.50
Riebeek Cellars, Swartland, South Africa
Riebeek Cellars vineyards are located in the fertile Riebeek Valley, where the climate is very similar to the Mediterranean, but the terrior is distinctively South African. Riebeek Cellars Pinotage is light and easy-drinking with big, juicy flavours of ripe cherry and plum, complemented by well-integrated notes of liquorice and oak on the finish.
54. MERLOT-GRENACHE, 2010 125ml 2.60 175ml 3.65 250ml 5.05
Les Terrasses, Vin de Pays de Coteaux de l'Ardeche, France 14.95
A Soft, rounded and fruity red from long established vineyards in the foothills between the Ardeche and La Baume rivers. Deep coloured bouquet of ripe cherry fruit, very approachable, with emphasis on ripeness and "crunchy" fruit with excellent balance.
55. TEMPRANILLO, Castillo de Montblanc, 2009 18.00
Conca de Barbera, Catalonia, Spain
This takes the famous red grape of Rioja to high altitude, cooler vineyards in the hills of Catalonia. Deep purple in colour with herbs and cherries on the scent, and flavours of spicy plums, tobacco leaf and red cherries. Extremely quaffable!
56. MALBEC 'Don David' Reserve, 2009 23.00
Michel Torino, Cafayate Valley, Argentina
From the northerly 'roof of the world' vineyards at Cafayate, this is a powerful Malbec with plenty of rich black fruit overlaid with a smattering of chocolate and coffee oak well balanced with sweet & soft tannins. Very impressive and complex.
57. MERLOT, 2011 18.00
Cornellana Wines, Rapel Valley, Chile 125ml 3.25 175ml 4.40 250ml 6.10
Rich, deep and plummy, with hints of chocolate on the nose. It is easy to see why Chile has become a spiritual home for Merlot.
58. COTES DU RHONE VILLAGES, 'Visan', 2010 27.00
Domaine Roche-Audran, Buisson, Rhone Valley, France
A deep-coloured meaty red with excellent purity of fruit and a fleshiness combined with a suppleness that is so rarely achieved. A wonderful finish and complexity. This is very talented wine-making indeed.

59. MASSAYA 'Cuvee Classic' Red, 2008 30.50
Brunier, Ghosn & Hebrard, Bekaa Valley, Lebanon
One of our most exciting discoveries, a collaboration between one of the best producers of Chateaufneuf du Pape (Daniel Brunier of Vieux Telegraph), Dominique Hebrard of St Emilion (Chateau Trianon) and the Lebanese Proprietors, Sami and Ramzi Ghosn, a blend of Cinsault and Cabernet Sauvignon, smooth, supple and very spicy. Quite amazing!
60. MONTE VELHO RED, 2010 125ml 3.75 175ml 5.25 250ml 7.25 21.50
Esporao, Alentejo, Portugal
This top-quality red is made from local Alentejo varieties (Aragones aka Tempranillo/Trincadeira/ Castelao/Tinta Caiada), most of which are unknown to British wine drinkers...it's far removed from Shiraz and Cabernet! Soft, elegant and very approachable with masses of full-flavoured summer berry fruits, a judicious touch of oak and ripe, soft tannins.
61. TEMPRANILLO-CABERNET SAUVIGNON Crianza 2005 25.50
Enate, Somontano, Spain
Enate have been at the forefront of the fantastic wines that have been coming from Somontano in recent years with colossal investment in the winery and international acclaim for its premium quality organically farmed wines.
The Tempranillo-Cabernet Sauvignon (70:30) Crianza is cherry coloured with an intense and complex bouquet, rich in smoky spicy tones over a base of ripe fruit. This wine is full bodied with well balanced tannins and a fantastic long, toasty finish.
63. CHÂTEAU LA TOUR DE BY, 2007 37.50
Cru Grand Bourgeois, Medoc, Bordeaux, France
Widely regarded as the most consistent of all the Cru Bourgeois wines due to a ferociously rigorous selection of grapes in the winery. Deeply coloured, full bodied and concentrated with a rich blackberry character and ripe supple tannins.
64. SHIRAZ, Moore's Creek, 2009 21.00
Tyrell's Wines, South-Eastern Australia
Deep and vibrant, with a blackberry spiciness, hint of eucalyptus, and fine grained tannins. Everything we look for from this popular grape.
65. BAROLO RISERVA, 2004 57.00
Costa di Bussia, Piedmont, Italy
Award winning Barolo from a great producer. Matured in oak casks for 3 years to develop slightly gamey & spicy tones which Barolo Riservas are famed. This great wine has firm tannins combined with ripe fruit flavours and a long finish.

66. CHÂTEAU HAUT-GUIRAUD 'Péché du Roy', 2008 34.00
St. Ciers-de-Canesse, Côtes de Bourg, Bordeaux, France
Château Haut-Guiraud is situated in the Côtes de Bourg commune of St. Ciers-de-Canesse, about 3 kilometres inland from the Gironde. Made from a blend of 70% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% old vine Malbec, the wine displays a rich, deep purple colour with a floral, raspberry-tinged nose and well integrated vanilla oakiness. It has a pervasive finish with great freshness and balance. An exceptional find and a great alternative to the more expensive wines of St Emilion. *Bordeaux Regional Trophy Winner in the 2010 Decanter Wine Awards.*
67. CABERNET SAUVIGNON, 'Cuma' 2010 125ml 3.35 175ml 4.55 250ml 6.30 18.50
Michel Torino, Cafayate Valley, Argentina
Made with 100% organic grapes the Torino Cabernet Sauvignon is deep ruby red in colour. This outstanding wine displays blackcurrant aromas with lots of cassis and firm leather in a rustic style. A meaty palate and finish where black olives and pepper stand out.
68. CHATEAU PONTET-CANET 2004 80.00
5eme Cru Classe, Pauillac, Bordeaux
The extraordinary effort that Alfred Tesseron has made at Pontet-Canet has been clearly rewarded by the remarkable press that these wines have had in the past few years. Numerous 'Bordeaux-watchers' are now comparing Pontet-Canet to a 'super-second.' Bordering the vineyards of Lafite and Mouton, there are just under 80 hectares under vine and the style of Pontet today has little to do with the austere wines that were the property's trade-mark until the early 1990's. The aromas show off masses of spicy black berry overtones whilst the palate is characterised by an unusual purity of fruit which is held together by super-fine tannins. The 2004 was a classic vintage with generous lashing of softening tannins and a complex, lingering finish. Cabernet Sauvignon 65% Merlot 30% Cabernet Franc 5%
70. RIDGE ZINFANDEL, Geyserville, 2006 52.50
Ridge Vineyards, Cupertino, Santa Cruz Mountains, California, USA
Paul Draper has been the wine maker at ridge since 1969 and is one of the main revivalists of the Zinfandel grape in California. This is a big, opulent, and decadent wine with a voluptuous texture and a focused, fleshy, black cherry & spicy fruit finish. A real classic from a great vineyard & wine maker.
71. CHATEAUNEUF DU PAPE, 2008 49.00
Domaine de la Roquette, Rhone, France
Surpassing its more famous sister Vieux Telegraphe in recent press tastings (both estates are run by the Brunier brothers) Very rich, with an intense blackberry and liquorice fruitiness, unfiltered to retain the true character of the region. A "benchmark" wine of genuine world class.

Rosé and Blush wines

73. WHITE ZINFANDEL 15.00
Cutlers Crest, California
On the sweeter side of medium, with aromatic strawberry fruit and a concentrated summer fruit palate. Very easy drinking.
74. CHÂTEAU HAUTRIAN ROSE, 2010 19.50
Rions, Bordeaux Rose, France
A juicy blend of Merlot & Cabrenet Franc, showing bright redcurrant aromas and superb freshness & brightness. A wine to take seriously whatever the season.
75. SYRAH-GRENACHE, 2010 125ml 2.60 175ml 3.65 250ml 5.05 14.95
Les Terrasses, Vin de Pays de Coteaux de l'Ardeche, France
A crisp rose from the mountains of the Cavernes full of fresh strawberry and raspberry fruitiness.

82. MONBAZILLAC, 2005 70ml 3.85 18.50
Chateau Vari, Monbazillac, France
A blend of late harvest Sauvignon Blanc, Semillon, and Muscadelle. Distinctly orange-tinted in colour and displaysd juicy flavours of peach with hints of toffee and spice.
